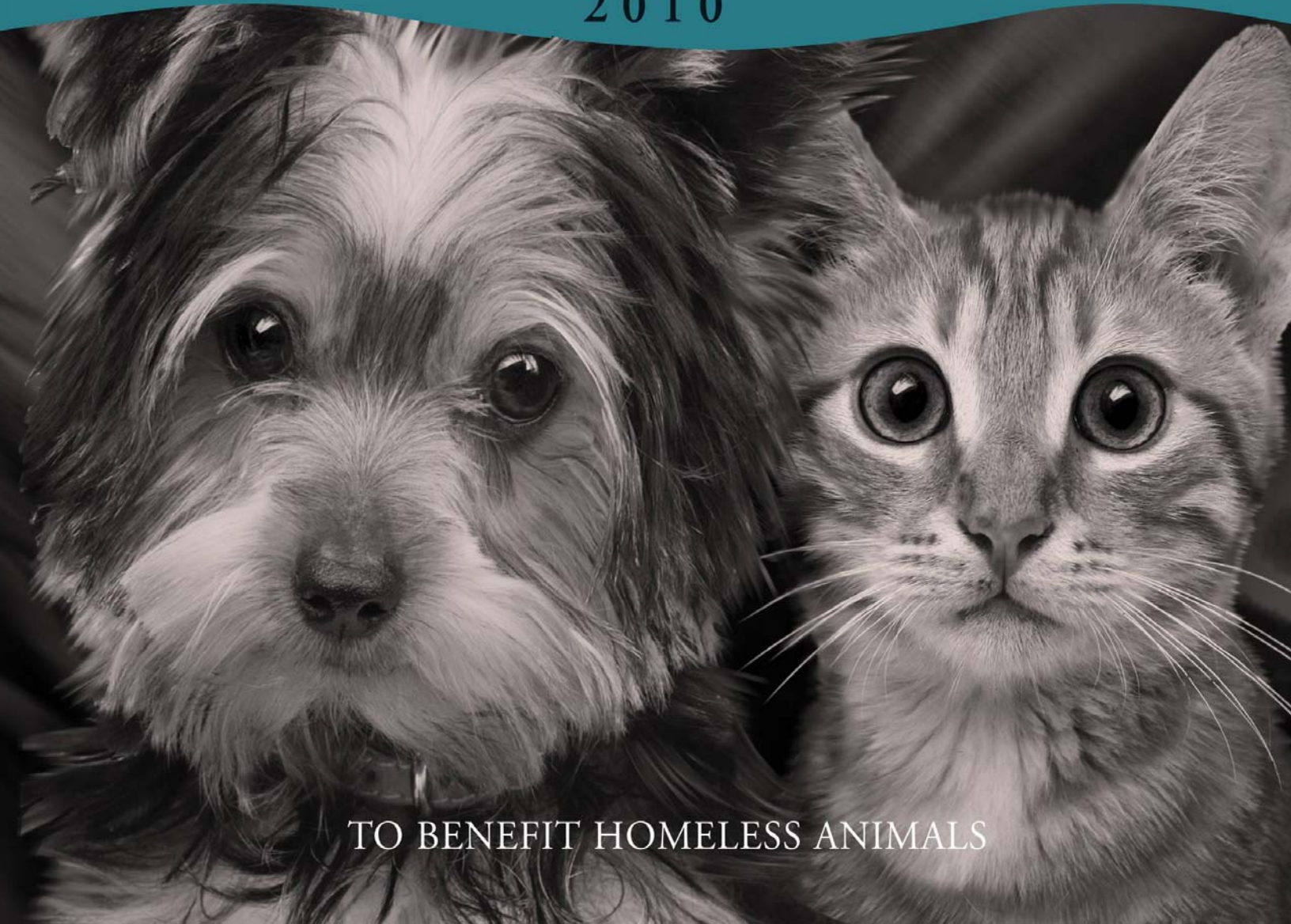

But the adage, "every dog has his day" held true for Clancy when his angel arrived. Though he couldn't see her, her kind voice and soft touch put him at ease and he knew he would never be left all alone again.

Before Tails of Hope took Clancy into rescue, he'd had a pretty rough life. A fall from a porch at a young age left him blind in both eyes, and after years of rough living, he somehow lost a toe and has a permanent tear in one ear. When his "people" moved away, they left Clancy and his canine brothers and sisters behind to fend for themselves. Clancy was the last of the lot to be rescued. How scary it must have been for him, to be left totally alone, removed from all that was familiar to him, without the benefit of sight.

Clancy's adoptive family initially took him in as a temporary foster. But this amazing dog quickly stole their hearts, and he is now a permanent resident in their home. He is dearly loved, and will never again be left behind. Clancy's family tells us that, *"Clancy's past hasn't quashed his spirit. His toothy grin and cocked head greet us every morning upon our awakening, and he loves to sidle up with a person while watching TV or (horrors!) during an algebra lesson. Clancy isn't just special needs, he's a special dog."*
